## **BOSIER DIRECTS PUBLIC TO GET ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR BAKER RECALL ELECTION FROM ASSESSOR'S OFFICE**

**LITTLETON, CO (Jan. 8, 2004)** – Arapahoe County Assessor Ed Bosier announced today that eligible voters wishing to participate in the Feb. 24 recall election by absentee ballot should contact his office to request such ballots. Bosier also reminded the public that, absentee ballots aside, the recall election will take place in polling locations and not by mail.

Typically, election matters such as absentee ballot requests are handled by a county clerk's office. However, since Arapahoe County Clerk & Recorder Tracy Baker is the subject of the recall effort, Bosier recommends that voters request absentee ballot applications from, and return them completed to, his office. Specifically, applications are available by:

The last day to apply for an absentee ballot for the Baker election is Feb. 20, although those wishing to receive their ballots by mail must file their applications by Feb. 17.

### **About the Arapahoe County Assessor's Office**

The Assessor's Office discovers, lists, classifies and values all real and personal property in Arapahoe County. The Office is also responsible for maintaining public records, including ownership and parcel maps; submitting the Abstract of Assessment to the Colorado Division of Property Taxation; certifying values to taxing entities; and producing the warrant roll. The Arapahoe County Assessor, Ed Bosier, began working for the Office in 1987 as a certified appraiser/supervisor in Land Development. Voters first elected him to the Office of the Assessor in 1995. He is currently serving his third term, which expires January of 2007.
