Homicide Suspect In Custody

On Sunday, October 17, 2004 at 1:28 P.M., the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received an E-911 call reporting a homicide at 17152 East Lake Drive, Centennial, Colorado. The caller stated that he had killed his wife and set a fire in the home. When deputies arrived on scene they discovered an active fire at the residence. Deputies witnessed an adult male walking out of the front door of the residence. Deputies took the subject into custody, without incident. The suspect is identified as:

Sheriff's Deputies determined that an adult female victim, located in an upstairs bedroom of the residence, was deceased. The female victim, the wife of the suspect, is identified as:

The cause of death of Ms. Lemay will be determined, pending further investigation by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office and the Arapahoe County Coroner's Office.

There was no one else inside the residence. The Parker Fire Department responded and extinguished the fire.

Mr. Lemay was transported by ambulance to the Littleton Hospital for treatment of several self-inflicted cuts and minor burns, which were sustained prior to the arrival of deputies. The suspect has been released from the hospital and has been booked into the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office Detentions Facility on charges of:

C.R.S. 18-3-102 Murder in the First Degree, a Class 1 Felony

A Class 1 felony is punishable by a sentence of life imprisonment without parole or death.

and

C.R.S. 18-4-102 First Degree Arson, Class 3 Felony

A Class 3 felony is punishable by a sentence of imprisonment for a term of four to twelve years.
