ARAPAHOE SHERIFF COMPLETES ADVANCED LEADERSHIP TRAINING OPPORTUNITY

Arapahoe County Sheriff Grayson Robinson recently graduated from the 52nd Session of the **LAW ENFORCEMENT LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT SEMINAR (LEEDS)**, presented by the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Quantico, Virginia. The curriculum of the Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar, facilitated by an internationally recognized faculty, includes training in leadership, problem solving, risk management, ethics, terrorism prevention, critical incident response, legal issues and information sharing. The LEEDS training opportunity is provided each year to only eighty law enforcement executives, selected from around the world.

Members of the 52nd Session of the Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar include law enforcement executives from local and state agencies of the United States, Canada, Australia, Ireland, Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Finland, as well as the United States Marine Corps, the United States Army, the U.S. Naval Criminal Investigative Service, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration. In addition to the professional growth provided through the unique learning opportunity, participants of each LEEDS program continue to share information and solve difficult public safety challenges through the support provided by the international network of LEEDS graduates.
