Arapahoe County elected officials will be sworn into office in January *Public invited to attend Jan. 2 and Jan. 9 ceremonies*

Citizens are invited to attend swearing-in ceremonies for the Arapahoe County Assessor, Board of County Commissioners, Clerk and Recorder, Coroner, Sheriff and Treasurer, which will be held Jan. 2 and Jan. 9 in the County Administration Building East Hearing Room 5334 S. Prince St., Littleton.

Treasurer-elect Doug Milliken will take the oath of office before Arapahoe County Judge William B. Sylvester at 9:30 a.m., Jan. 2. Milliken will be sworn in during a separate ceremony because state law calls for the Treasurer to be sworn in by the first business day of the year. Milliken, who is serving his first term as Treasurer, is a Certified Public Accountant and previously served as the City of Centennial's Treasurer.

Arapahoe County Commissioners-elect Jim Dyer and Pat Noonan, along with Assessor-elect Corbin Sakdol, Clerk and Recorder Nancy A. Doty, Coroner Michael Dobersen and Sheriff Grayson Robinson, will take the oath of office at 7 p.m., Jan. 9.

Dyer, who will replace outgoing Commissioner Bernie Zimmer, will begin his first term representing District 2. For the past six years, he has been the Republican Senator from District 26.

Noonan, who will replace outgoing Commissioner Lynn Myers, will begin her first term representing District 4. She brings more than 20 years of administrative and political experience to the County, including five years as a Congressional employee in Washington, D.C.

Sakdol is serving his first term as Assessor, but is no stranger to the County. He has worked for the Assessor's Office for the past 16 years and is a licensed Certified General Appraiser, licensed Real Estate Broker and has a degree in Architectural Technology. As Assessor, Sakdol will be responsible for the valuation of approximately 190,000 real estate parcels and 17,000 personal property assets.

Nancy Doty is serving her second term as Clerk and Recorder. She is a State Certified Administrator of Elections and a member of the Colorado County Clerks Association, the Colorado Municipal Clerks, the Election Center, and the International Association of Clerks, Recorders, Election Officials and Treasurers.

Dobersen is serving his fourth term as Coroner and has been with Arapahoe County for 13 years. He is physician trained and board certified in Forensic Pathology, which is the branch of medicine concerned with the investigation of sudden and unexpected violent or suspicious deaths.

With more than 34 years in law enforcement, Robinson is serving his second term as Sheriff. He joined the Sheriff's Office in 1992 and served six years as Undersheriff before the County Commissioners appointed him to the position when former Sheriff Patrick Sullivan retired in 2002.
