**Sheriff Robinson Appointed  
To Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice**

Governor Bill Ritter has appointed Arapahoe County Sheriff Grayson Robinson to the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice. The Criminal and Juvenile Justice Commission was formed by the Colorado Legislature to explore meaningful solutions to the complex challenges associated with the justice system, ensure the public safety and protect the rights of victims. The twenty-six (26) member Commission is expected to make recommendations for the improvement of the administration of justice, after completing comprehensive examinations of the justice system and evaluating promising reforms.

The Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice is responsible to:

1. Conduct studies, review best practices, perform empirical analysis and collect evidence based data regarding sentencing policies and practices, with a focus on the reduction of recidivism and the prevention of re-victimization.
2. Investigate effective alternatives to incarceration.
3. Explore cost effective crime prevention programs.
4. To prepared and present an annual report of findings and recommendations.

“Evaluating best practices, exploring meaningful reforms to the Colorado justice system and presenting well considered recommendations will make a difference. I am honored to be appointed to the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice and am very proud to be given the opportunity to serve the people of Colorado as a Commissioner” said Sheriff Robinson.
